In John's words they only play on the south road, though I suspect in recent times they are playing harder than in the past as can be seen with this year's results. However their main aim has always been the north road and they have produced some brilliant results over the years with 2019 being no exception with three Combine wins on the north road and more Club and Fed wins than I can count. Well done on another great season. This week's winner was a 2y blue hen from his own family based on the Soontjens and some very selective crosses over the years which have made a top family of all round pigeons.

Coming in 2nd in both clubs was John Cowlin with a yearling Frans Zwols hen which had not raced during the early part of the year and was having only her second outing.

Taking 3rd, 4th and 5th Hullbridge and in the Thames Open was Micky Watts who clocked three quick fire young birds, the first two were Frans Zwols bred by Formula 1 Lofts and are a nest pair; 3rd on the clock is a Frans Zwols cross. Just in case you are wondering why we have old and young birds in the same result, it is because the Thames has any age racing from the first to last race each season. Meaning any pigeon can win or take positions each week regardless of age.

Taking the 6th, 7th and 8th spots again both in Hullbridge and the Thames Open we have Tony Buckfield who also clocked three young birds in four seconds all from his own family of birds based around the old original Scontjens.

was A. Hammond & Son who clocked three old cocks in 40 seconds to finish 9th, 10th and 19th Open Thames.

David Coward-Talbott was back to winning ways and took the red card clocking a 2y blue pied cock in Laindon and he was followed by Pat Newell with a young hen and Alex Mackenzie with a 2y hen.

The winner in the Colchester Club was A Royce, Rodney has had another good season in both Colchester and the Thames and this week clocked a yearling hen who has carded a few times this season. Next up was the first young bird in Colchester Club and this was timed by Keith & Linda Turner & Sons one from their Red Daniel van Reet family. Taking 3rd and 4th spot was Mr & Mrs Brace with a pair of nestmates bred from a pair from Albert Hendrex, this pair bred a winner in 2018 so look like a decent pair of breeders.


Of course we will also be running the Messac Open race again in September.
